DISCIPLE COMMITMENT SHEET

Characteristics of a Disciple

A desire to grow spiritually | Willingness to be open and honest with others | Teachable heart open to instruction, challenge, and growth | A desire for relationships with others | Commitment to meeting together and engaging with the scriptures and discipleship content.

Expectations and Requirements

Let's be honest- there is a reason people chose not to follow Jesus when he called them. Discipleship is hard work! In order to be discipled, we must be open to correction, committed to growth, and willing to open the good, the bad, and the ugly parts of our lives to others. Disciples must attend and engage in connection times with their Disciple Makers. They must be willing to prioritize their spiritual growth above all else.

CONNECTIONS FOR MAKING DISCIPLES

BUILDING DEEP RELATIONSHIPS

Daily Connections: 1 - 4 weeks

In the beginning, we strongly encourage you to have daily contact in your disciple group. Some suggested connections are: Read a bible reading plan together in the YouVersion app & share comments on what God spoke to you // Text feed - text the group with a few prompts (how they are doing, about their day, if they are struggling, prayer, etc.) // Prayer phone call - get on the phone and pray for each other's needs.

Weekly Connections:

We need more than just a digital connection when we're sharing life together. Each week we want to spend time together. This is your opportunity to have intentional discussions about life, God's word, and discipleship content. Get creative with this time! i.e. Morning coffee // family dinner // a shared interest or activity of the group // Serve together at a non-profit. The goals are to be together, have intentional conversations, and engage with scripture.

Monthly Connections: Last 2 months

Everyone is growing together, and you've been living life together. The heart of this phase is to still connect and challenge each other to grow, while making an effort to multiply. This is the time to challenge each other to pray for the people God is leading you to disciple next. As you disciple others, stay connected to keep growing and make sure the new groups are solid.

MAKE DISCIPLES. Remember: this is an organic process. The goal isn't to stick to a rigid timeline. You may find that you can move more quickly or need to slow down. We want to walk at the pace of natural growth and focus on developing in our disciple groups.



We have a short survey to help you know your current stage of spiritual growth and how you can keep moving forward. This short assessment asks questions about loving attitudes along the Spiritual Continuum, beliefs, personal spiritual practices, virtues and faith in action. We encourage you to take this at the beginning and end of your discipleship process.



CREATEACCOUNT

This survey is 36 questions long. Try not to overthink it. After you complete the survey you will immediately get an email with your results along with some tips to keep moving forward in your faith.

REVEAL SURVEY

FIRST MEETING

This first meeting is about getting to know one other. Take time to review the guidelines and set meeting and connection times. You can use the suggested questions to help people open up. Encourage each person to share the results of their Reveal assessment.

DISCIPLE GROUP GUIDELINES

Be Prepared

You will get out of this process what you put into it. From Bible reading, Right Now Media videos, or content topics, come ready to engage in the process.

Open and Honest Conversations

It can be easy to hide parts of our lives we don't want others to see. But growth happens when we are open and honest with each other. Lead the way in being vulnerable so others can be open as well.

Confidentiality

This group and relationships thrive off of trust. You will hear personal things about others in this group. Don't share these stories with others outside the group.

Show Up

We can all use the "I'm busy" excuse, but relationships are vital to our spiritual growth. Make an attempt to be present and engaged at all of your weekly meetings.

No Fixing People

Although we give spiritual advice and can help each other by sharing our life experiences, our goal isn't to fix people. We believe that is the work of the Holy Spirit.

This is Not Counseling

Although we open our lives to create deep relationships, discipleship is not professional counseling. When counseling is needed, refer people to NCC's counseling resources.

QUESTIONS AND DISCUSSION

Share your season of life - Are you married, a stay-at-home parent, in a demanding career?* What current struggles are you dealing with?

Share your spiritual journey - What did your spiritual assessment show you about yourself? Are there places you feel stuck spiritually?

Are there key areas you're wanting to spiritually grow in?

NEXT TWO WEEKS

These two weeks are about learning about each other and building deep relationships.

The tendency may be for people to rush through this process or not be fully engaged.

This process of sharing your life timeline will help build closer connections. Ask questions to help you understand one another better.

Key moments of spiritual growth and transformation These can be seemingly small or big, but if it stood out to you, write it down.

Wins

Celebrations and moments of joy. Examples are graduations, marriage, birth of a child, dreams and goals you have achieved.

Losses

Anything that felt like a loss is one. Loss of a loved one, death of a dream or goal, failures or mistakes in your life are all losses.


Life Change


These are any other major life changes that didn't fit into the categories above but have significantly shaped you. i.e. Starting college, moving, beginning a new career, etc.

KEY SPIRITUAL BELIEFS

SALVATION BY GRACE

The belief of salvation by grace is the core of our Christian faith by proclaiming God's victory over sin in our lives. From the first man and women, our disobedience results in spiritual death, which separates us from God. Nothing we've done or could do can bridge that separation. Man's only hope of redemption is through God's grace.

Acts 16:30-31

He then brought them out and asked, "Sirs, what must I do to be saved?" They replied, "Believe in the Lord Jesus, and you will be saved—you and your household."

Ephesians 2:8-9

For it is by grace you have been saved, through faith—and this is not from yourselves, it is the gift of God—not by works, so that no one can boast.

Romans 3:22-24

This righteousness is given through faith in Jesus Christ to all who believe. There is no difference between Jew and Gentile, for all have sinned and fall short of the glory of God, and all are justified freely by his grace through the redemption that came by Christ Jesus.

KEY TERMS

Salvation // Saved

Salvation is a gift from God. The Bible teaches that none of us is good enough to earn salvation. We must accept it as a gift from God. God freely gives this wonderful gift to all who will accept it on His terms. We receive salvation when we admit to God that we have sinned and are truly sorry for our sins and when we receive, by faith, the Lord Jesus Christ into our lives as our personal Lord and Savior. We simply trust Him to forgive us our sins and to give us the gift of eternal life.

Sin

Sin separates us from God. This refers to us "missing the mark" or our state as human beings. But we cannot "fix" our sin problem by just trying really hard to be good. That's why our Lord Jesus Christ died on the cross--to pay the death penalty for our sins in our place.

KEY SPIRITUAL BELIEFS

SALVATION BY GRACE

This grace brings deliverance, healing and a restored life through Jesus. Whether a new believer or a mature Christian, every believer is dependent on God's free gift of grace.

Romans 10:9-13

If you declare with your mouth, "Jesus is Lord," and believe in your heart that God raised him from the dead, you will be saved. For it is with your heart that you believe and are justified, and it is with your mouth that you profess your faith and are saved. As Scripture says, "Anyone who believes in him will never be put to shame." For there is no difference between Jew and Gentile—the same Lord is Lord of all and richly blesses all who call on him, for, "Everyone who calls on the name of the Lord will be saved.

Titus 2:11

For the grace of God has appeared that offers salvation to all people.

KEY TERMS

Repent

To repent means to change one's mind and heart completely. Usually, we use the word to mean to change one's mind and heart completely about sin.

Conviction

When we have done things that are wrong, and the Holy Spirit reminds us that we have sinned. Also can be used to refer to strong beliefs on which we base our lives.

Justification

Justification is the act of all our sins being forgiven and cleansed away from us forever. The words "righteous" and "justified" come from the same Greek word.

KEY SPIRITUAL BELIEFS

AUTHORITY OF SCRIPTURE

We believe the Bible is the inspired Word of God and has authority over what we say and do. The Scriptures, both the Old and New Testaments, are verbally inspired by God and are the revelation of God to man, it tells us the story of God's plan of salvation.

Hebrews 4:12

For the word of God is alive and active. Sharper than any double-edged sword, it penetrates even to dividing soul and spirit, joints and marrow; it judges the thoughts and attitudes of the heart.

2 Timothy 3:16

All Scripture is God-breathed and is useful for teaching, rebuking, correcting and training in righteousness, so that the servant of God may be thoroughly equipped for every good work.

1 Thessalonians 2:13

And we also thank God continually because, when you received the word of God, which you heard from us, you accepted it not as a human word, but as it actually is, the word of God, which is indeed at work in you who believe.

KEY TERMS

Translations

The Bible was originally written in Hebrew and Greek. So, there have been many translations making the Scripture accessible to different languages and the adaptation of those languages. Some are "word for word" translations (KJV, ESV), some being "thought for thought" (NIV, NLT) and others "phrase for phrase" (The Message, Passion Translation).

Gospel

The Gospel is the good news of what Jesus did to redeem his people (his birth, life, death, and resurrection). It is good news because we are unable to save ourselves. "The Gospels" refers to the books of the Bible where Jesus' life is recorded - Matthew, Mark, Luke and John.

KEY SPIRITUAL BELIEFS

AUTHORITY OF SCRIPTURE

The Scriptures define the believer's worldview, morality, and ethics. Moreover, the Scriptures are not simply one authority among others; they are the final authority.

2 Peter 1:20-21

Above all, you must understand that no prophecy of Scripture came about by the prophet's own interpretation of things. For prophecy never had its origin in the human will, but prophets, though human, spoke from God as they were carried along by the Holy Spirit.

Matthew 5:18

For truly I tell you, until heaven and earth disappear, not the smallest letter, not the least stroke of a pen, will by any means disappear from the Law until everything is accomplished.

Psalms 119

KEY TERMS

Infallible

Often used with the word "inerrant." It means that since the Bible is God's Word, it cannot fail or mislead in any way. It is perfect.

Inerrancy

The belief that God caused His Word, the Bible, to be written perfectly and without any errors at all. Because of this, we take every part of Scripture as truth and instruction.

Old/New Testament

The first part of the Bible that is Hebrew Scriptures. In the New Testament, the Hebrew Scriptures are simply called "the scriptures" or "the holy scriptures".

The NT contains the Gospels, the Epistles and the book of Revelation. Together with the Old Testament makes the whole Bible.

KEY SPIRITUAL BELIEFS

ONE TRUE GOD

We believe that the God of the Bible is the one true God, demonstrated in 3 persons: the Father, Son and Holy Spirit. The one true God has revealed Himself as "I AM," the Creator of heaven and earth and the Redeemer of mankind. There is no other god, "truth" or way.

Isaiah 43:10-11

"You are my witnesses," declares the Lord, "and my servant whom I have chosen, so that you may know and believe me and understand that I am he. Before me no god was formed, nor will there be one after me. I, even I, am the Lord, and apart from me there is no savior. "

1 Timothy 2:5

For there is one God, and there is one mediator between God and men, the man Christ Jesus,

Isaiah 44:6

"This is what the Lord says— Israel's King and Redeemer, the Lord Almighty: I am the first and I am the last; apart from me there is no God.

KEY TERMS

Trinity

The Bible teaches that God reveals
Himself as One God who exists as three
persons: God the Father, God the Son
(Jesus), and God the Holy Spirit. The
word "Trinity" combines the prefix "tri-"
(meaning "three" as in tricycle, triangle, or
tripod) with the word "unity" meaning
one.

Monotheism

The belief in one God - Christians, Jews and Muslims are monotheistic.

Omnipotent

Means "all powerful." It is a word that describes God alone. He has perfect and total power in the entire universe. He has the power to do anything He chooses to do.

KEY SPIRITUAL BELIEFS

ONE TRUE GOD

We believe that the God of the Bible is the one true God, demonstrated in 3 persons: the Father, Son and Holy Spirit. The one true God has revealed Himself as "I AM," the Creator of heaven and earth and the Redeemer of mankind. There is no other god, "truth" or way.

1 Corinthians 8:6

.. yet for us there is but one God, the Father, from whom all things came and for whom we live; and there is but one Lord, Jesus Christ, through whom all things came and through whom we live.

1 John 5:20

We know also that the Son of God has come and has given us understanding, so that we may know him who is true. And we are in him who is true by being in his Son Jesus Christ. He is the true God and eternal life.

1 Timothy 1:17

Now to the King eternal, immortal, invisible, the only God, be honor and glory for ever and ever. Amen.

KEY TERMS

Omnipresent

Means that God can be everywhere at the same time. Only God is omnipresent. (It is important to remember that "omnipresence" is not the same as a pagan belief called "pantheism."

Omniscient

Means that God knows everything there is to know. He has all knowledge and there is nothing hidden from Him.

KEY SPIRITUAL BELIEFS

SPIRIT FILLED LIVING

When Jesus left earth, He promised that we'd not be alone. The Holy Spirit came to live inside us to lead, empower and point to Jesus. Being Spirit-filled means being sensitive to the Holy Spirit's prompting, displaying the fruits of the Spirit, and a submission to God.

Acts 1:8

But you will receive power when the Holy Spirit comes on you; and you will be my witnesses in Jerusalem, and in all Judea and Samaria, and to the ends of the earth.

Galatians 5:22-23

But the fruit of the Spirit is love, joy, peace, forbearance, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, gentleness and self-control. Against such things there is no law.

John 14:15-18

If you love me, keep my commands. And I will ask the Father, and he will give you another advocate to help you and be with you forever— the Spirit of truth. The world cannot accept him, because it neither sees him nor knows him. But you know him, for he lives with you and will be in you. I will not leave you as orphans; I will come to you.

KEY TERMS

Pentecost

The festival when the disciples received the Holy Spirit. Often thought of as the birth of the Church.

Speaking in Tongues

The New Testament mentions both speaking and praying in tongues. When the Holy Spirit came on Pentecost, the believers spoke in tongues. This gift is a "heavenly language" to intercede for others and encourage people.

Indwelling of the Spirit

When we receive Jesus Christ, the Holy Spirit of God comes to live inside us or dwell inside us.

Revelation

Truth that men cannot figure out on their own, but which must be given to them by God, is called "revelation." The whole Bible is the revelation of God and God's truth to men.

KEY SPIRITUAL BELIEFS

SPIRIT FILLED LIVING

All believers in Jesus Christ have God's Spirit living within them, or dwelling within them; but not all believers live filled or controlled by the Holy Spirit.

John 16:13

But when he, the Spirit of truth, comes, he will guide you into all the truth. He will not speak on his own; he will speak only what he hears, and he will tell you what is yet to come.

Romans 8:14

For those who are led by the Spirit of God are the children of God.

KEY TERMS

Walking in the Spirit

We are living our lives in a way that shows we are empowered by the Holy Spirit. When we are filled by the Spirit, we see an attitude of joy and thanksgiving as well as a posture of humility toward God and of submission to one another.

Spiritual Warfare

Christians have an enemy--Satan. In His Word, God has given us weapons which He commands us to use for that purpose.

Prompting of the Spirit

When we receive the Lord Jesus Christ as our personal Lord and Savior, the Holy Spirit comes to live in our lives to give us wisdom and direction. He speaks to us by giving us thoughts to do the right thing. His promptings will never contradict or disagree with God's Word.

How essential is the Holy Spirit for Christian living?



KEY TERMS

Communion

Communion is a name for the "Lord's Supper." The word "communion" emphasizes the fellowship we have with Jesus because of His sacrifice on the cross.

Batpism

begin submerged into water as a sign to others you've been made new and living a new life in Christ.

Kingdom of God

Also called the Kingdom Of Heaven is the spiritual realm over which God reigns as King and also applies to the fulfillment of God's will

The Body of Christ

The body of Christ is made up of every person who has given their life to Jesus. They work in the ministry that He leads, which differs from person to person, for the edification and unity of The Church.

All the believers were together and had everything in common. They sold property and possessions to give to anyone who had need. Every day they continued to meet together in the temple courts. They broke bread in their homes and ate together with glad and sincere hearts, praising God and enjoying the favor of all the people. And the Lord added to their number daily those who were being saved.

Hebrews 10:24-25

And let us consider how we may spur one another on toward love and good deeds, not giving up meeting together, as some are in the habit of doing, but encouraging one another—and all the more as you see the Day approaching.

KEY TERMS

The Bride of Christ

The Bride is another term for The Church. This symbolism is used throughout the New Testament to show how Jesus loves and cares for The Church while The Church is waiting for her groom.

Brothers / Sisters

The "brothers" and "sisters" are those who are a part of the church of Christ.

Evangelical

Christians who believe the Bible is God's Word and who believe that the Gospel of Jesus should be shared with others.



KEY SPIRITUAL BELIEFS

IDENTITY IN CHRIST

When we accept Jesus as our Savior, our identity and position in life changes. Our identity is no longer found in our status or the words of others, but by Jesus Himself. God intends for all people to find their identity in Him and be adopted into His family.

2 Corinthians 5:17

Therefore, if anyone is in Christ, the new creation has come: The old has gone, the new is here!

1 Peter 2:9

But you are a chosen people, a royal priesthood, a holy nation, God's special possession, that you may declare the praises of him who called you out of darkness into his wonderful light.

John 1:12

Yet to all who did receive him, to those who believed in his name, he gave the right to become children of God—

KEY TERMS

Coheirs with Christ

Jesus, the only Son of God, is the natural "heir" of the Father. Being a co-heir with Christ means that we, as God's adopted children, will share in the inheritance of Jesus. All that belongs to Jesus Christ will belong to us, the co-heirs, as well. Christ gives us His glory (John 17:22), His riches (2 Corinthians 8:9), and all things (Hebrews 1:2).

Adopted in Christ

We have been adopted or "grafted" into the family of God. It wasn't out right or anything that we did, but God in His grace called us his rightful children.

IDENTITY IN CHRIST

As part of this family, we are free from shame, chosen to carry God's love to this world and live in the confidence of being His son or daughter.

Ephesians 2:10

For we are God's handiwork, created in Christ Jesus to do good works, which God prepared in advance for us to do.

John 15:16

QUESTIONS

What does the way God created everything show us about Him?

What does chapter 3 of Genesis show us about our relationship with God?

Moses and the Exodus of God's people from slavery (Exodus 3 and 9-11)

Overview:: The people of God had been enslaved for 400 years in Egypt. Through many signs and wonders He frees His people and takes them to a mountain. At this place He shows them his presence and gives them a new way to live in relationship with Him and others around them.

KEY TERMS

Israelites

These were the people God had chosen that were descendants of Jacob (who later become known as Israel). They were part of God's plan of salvation for the world.

Passover

The people of God were told to sacrifice a lamb on the night the death angel would visit Egypt. They were to wipe the lamb's blood on their doorpost and the angel would passover their house.

QUESTIONS

What do these signs and wonders and the Passover show about who God is?

OLD TESTAMENT PRT 1

Fall of Jericho (Joshua 3 & 6)

Overview:: The people of God don't trust God and end up spending 40 years wandering in the desert. After that a new generation arises and God brings them into the land Him promised them when they came out of slavery.

KEY TERMS

Canaan

A geographical area was in the middle east. It was settled by the Moabites, Ammonites, and other tribal nations during the late 2nd millennium.

Promise Land

A geographical area that God had promised to Abraham that his descendants would inherit. God help them conqueror this land.

QUESTIONS

What did the promise land meant to Israel? What can that symbolize in our life?

What did God ask the people to do in order to win the victory in Jericho? Is there. a time God has asked you to do something that seemed difficult or challenging.

One of the judges was Samson.

KEY TERMS

Nazarite

A vow that's taken by individuals who have voluntarily dedicated themselves to God. It may limit their consumption of alcohol or other unclean foods.

Judge

Spiritual leaders of Israel that God used to rescue his people and remind them to follow God's word.

QUESTIONS

What are some of the pitfalls and traps Samson feel into?

What are some pitfalls or traps you have in your life?

David and Goliath (1 Samuel 17)

Overview:: The people of God asked God for a king to be like other nations. This was a bad decision. Their first king was named Saul and was a madman who was full of pride. God chose the second king a shepherd boy named David who had a heart for God.

KEY TERMS

Philistines

Enemies of the people of God that worshiped the God Dagon and were at constant war with the people of God.

Slingshot

Was a weapon that was made of leather that was used to defend people. A rock or hard piece of material could be thrown a fast speeds to disable an enemy.

QUESTIONS

Where was David's confidence?

How did David's past prepare him for the giant He was facing? What does God done in your past to prepare you for future giants or battles in your life?

OLD TESTAMENT PRT 2

Saul tries to kill David // David honors Saul (1 Samuel 24)

Overview: After Saul turned away from God. God had a prophet anointed David as the next king. This mad Saul mad and jealous so he vowed to kill David. He hunted David down to kill him.

KEY TERMS

Authority

A leader who has the right to being direction, correction or instruction into someone's life. Authority has been established by God.

Annointed

A Prophet or man of God would pour oil over someones head to signify God's purpose or calling over them. Such as in a new king being appointed.

QUESTIONS

How does David honor Saul as the authority in His life? How do you do this in your life?

What does true humility look like? What does true authority look like?

How should we as people of God deal with difficult leaders?

KEY TERMS

Baal

A god worshiped in many ancient Middle Eastern communities, especially among the Canaanites, who considered him a fertility deity.

Altar / Sacrifice

Offering an animals life as an act of worship to a spiritual being or God. This could be done as an act of worship or to receive favor from God or a spiritual being.

QUESTIONS

What are things we worship in our life that turn our hearts and love away from God?

What was powerful about Elijah's prayer and faith in God?

Daniel (Daniel 1,3, & 6)

Overview:: The people of God turned away from Him. He allowed them to be taken into exile by a neighboring country. They were in exile in an empire called Babylon. Daniel even in a different culture and land never forsakes God, but lives a life of conviction and no compromise.

KEY TERMS

Babylon

A nation north of Israel that conquered the people of God. It was a strong empire that was short lived and eventually fell to the Medes and Persians

Idol

A statue that symbolized a god offering and prayers could be offered as a representation of the god one served.

QUESTIONS

What characteristics do you see in the life of Daniel and the his friends? Which one of these do you admire the most

What is a moment where you had to trust God, maybe where it felt like you were in a fire?

OLD TESTAMENT PRT 3

Jonah (Jonah 1,& 3-4)

Overview:: Jonah was a prophet of God. God told Him to go and preached to his enemy the ninevites. Jonah ran from God and was swallowed by a large fish. He did obey God, and when He preached to the people they repented. However, Jonah got angry with God for making him share the love of God with His enemy.

QUESTIONS

Have you had moments where it was difficult to follow or obey God's voice?

Are you ever like Jonah where you want mercy and a second chance for yourself but not for those you dislike?

What does true repentance look like? What does this story show us about God's heart for us?

KEY TERMS

Advent

The 25 days of December leading up to Christmas. Christians have used these day to reflect on the birth of Christ and the true meaning of Christmas.

Wisemen

Ancient scholars and astronomers that would study the stars to foretell key moments and important events on the earth.

QUESTIONS

What do you as the significance of Jesus being born as a baby in God's salvation plan?

What is the impact or where Jesus was born and who was first told of His birth?

Jesus feeds five thousand people (John 6.1–15)

Overview:: Jesus began to do many miracles. He gained a large following of thousands. He had a small close group that were his true disciples. People were coming from all over the nation to witness the amazing miracles that were being done through this young rabbi.

KEY TERMS

Manana

Communion is a name for the "Lord's Supper." The word "communion" emphasizes the fellowship we have with Jesus because of His sacrifice on the cross.

Bread of Life

begin submerged into water as a sign to others you've been made new and living a new life in Christ.

QUESTIONS

So many people are following Jesus just to be feed and see the miracles? What are no pure motives people follow Jesus today?

NEW TESTAMENT PRT 1

The Sermon on the mount (Matthew 5 & 6)

Overview:: Jesus gathered a group of people on the side of a mountain and shared a teaching of what it looks like to live in God's world. He challenges us to live different from others as we love our neighbor and reflect God's love to those around. This is one of his most famous sermons.

QUESTIONS

These first verse that talk about a blessed life seem counterintuitive to us. What seems different to you about being blessed in God's kingdom versus what we think of as success in our culture?

In this part he talks about money a lot, why does he spend a large part of this focused on this topic? How do you in your life make sure money and possessions don't become the central focus in your life?

What do you think it means to love your neighbor? Not just an idea but how do you practically do this in your life?

NOTES

The parable of the prodigal son (Luke 15.11–32)

Overview:: Jesus used stories to convey the powerful truths of the kingdom of God. These many times are referred to as parables. He would share a truth through an illustration that people were familiar with. From seeds in a garden, to fishing Jesus was always using what is around us in the physical world to draw our attention to what is unseen in the world.

KEY TERMS

Prodigal

Prodigal means reckless or wasteful spending. It was used to describe situations where someone surprised you by their actions in spending or giving.

Inheritance

This was given after the father of the family died. To ask for it ahead of time was a great offense. In essence you were wishing that person was dead.

QUESTIONS

What does the heart of the Father in this story reveal about God?

Why is it easier to admit we are the prodigal son rather than the older brother?

Jesus raises Lazarus from the dead (John 11.1–44)

Overview:: Jesus continued to do many signs and wonders. His miracles many times were to show a spiritual truth, such as healing the blind to illustrate spiritual sight. Jesus in his time on earth developed close relationships. Lazarus was a close friend of Jesus.

KEY TERMS

Resurrection

The restoring of life to someone that has been officially died. This not done through medical means but through a supernatural act of God.

Mourners

During this time, people were hired to come and weep and cry with families that had lost someone. As odd as it seems to us it was a common thing in biblical time.

QUESTIONS

Why did Jesus weep if He knew He was about to raise Lazarus from the dead?

Why did this miracle upset the religious leaders so much?

NEW TESTAMENT PRT 2

Jesus is crucified & buried (Mark 15.20–41 & (Matthew 27.57–66) Jesus' resurrection (Matthew 28.1–15)

Overview: As the religious leaders became more and more jealous of the popularity and ministry of Jesus they looked for ways to kill Him. In the last chapters of the gospels we see how Jesus died.

KEY TERMS

Roman Centurion

Commanders over roman soldiers. In this society they had leadership and influence over others due to their position. Not only with this army but with others in society.

Ceremonial Burial

Jewish culture required spices, oils, and ointments cover the body along with fabrics and linens to preserve the body and hinder odors. It was an extensive process.

QUESTIONS

What do you think those that witnessed Jesus death were feeling? Roman soliders, religious leaders, His disciples?

What is the importance of Jesus not just dying but also being resurrected?

NEW TESTAMENT PRT 3

This is the part of the bible that is during and after the time of Christ. It highlights the story of God's son coming and dying for our sins. After the gospels we see the church being established and growing and spreading throughout the roman empire. (27 books // 9 authors // written over 55 years. // written in Greek)

The Holy Spirit is sent to the disciples (Acts 2.1–13)

Overview:: After His death and resurrection Jesus continued to meet and speak to His disciples for 40 days. After this He ascended into heaven. After his accession we see the growth and expansion of the church in the book of Acts and the epistles.

KEY TERMS

Pentecost

This was a Jewish festival that celebrated the first fruits of the wheat harvest. It also reminded the people where God visited them on Mount Sinai.

Tongues of Fire

Visible small pockets of fire that accompanied the Holy Spirit being given to the first disciples.

QUESTIONS

What is the importance of what these followers of Christ experience on this day?

How does this outpouring of God's Spirit effect them and the city of Jerusalem?

The conversion of Saul (Acts 9.1–19)

Overview:: As the church began to grow and spread it began to experience extreme persecution. From being placed in jail to even torture and death Jewish leaders and roman leaders tried to find ways to contain the spread of Christianity through painful means. One of these men was named Saul.

KEY TERMS

Pharisees

Jewish religious leaders who were very strict in regards to the law and religious practices. They were considered the elite in Jewish society.

Persecution

Physical pain, Verbal abuse, imprisonment or other forms of torture to prohibit or impede the spread of a religious belief.

QUESTIONS

How you have responded if God asked you to speak to someone like Paul? Have you ever felt challenged to share Jesus with someone that is difficult to speak with?

Saul thought He was doing something for God, but was fighting against Him. Have you ever been in a situation like this?



NEW TESTAMENT PRT 3

Paul and Silas in prison (Acts 16.16–40)

Overview:: Paul (who was Saul) after his conversion was one of the strongest components of the Christian faith. He planted many churches and took the gospel into new lands and nations. God used Paul to establish and create the structure for His church. These trips to distant lands were known as missionary trips.

QUESTIONS

Have you ever faced opposition or persecution because of your faith?

Is it easy for you to focus on Jesus or run to Him in the midst of dark nights in your life or hard seasons?

Worship is key to us seeing freedom. What are ways you worship and praise God in the midst of difficulties?

KEY SPIRITUAL PRACTICES

PERSONAL: PRAYER AND SOLITUDE

Throughout Scripture Jesus gives us examples of how He prayed and spent time in solitude. These practices remind us that God sees us and reigns over our lives. This connection with God through daily prayer and intentional times of solitude are vital to our spiritual health.

Matthew 4:1-2

Then Jesus was led by the Spirit into the wilderness to be tempted by the devil. 2 After fasting forty days and forty nights, he was hungry..

Luke 9:28

About eight days after Jesus said this, he took Peter, John and James with him and went up onto a mountain to pray.

Matthew 14:23

After he had dismissed them, he went up on a mountainside by himself to pray. Later that night, he was there alone.

But Jesus often withdrew to lonely places and prayed.

KEY TERMS

Silence & Solitude with God

"Alone time" with God can allow God to examine us. It can be a time of knowing God more deeply, a time of strengthening, a time of refreshment, a time of sharing our deepest concerns with God, and a time of simply being with the One who formed us and loves us beyond our understanding.

Listening to God

This is where we quiet our hearts to try to listen to God's voice. We don't hear God speak to us audible. However we can hear the prompting and guiding of His Spirit in our heart.

4 There are different kinds of gifts, but the same Spirit distributes them. 5 There are different kinds of service, but the same Lord. 6 There are different kinds of working, but in all of them and in everyone it is the same God at work.

KEY TERMS

Service

Jesus provides the ultimate example of what our faith should look like. He spent most of his ministry serving others. He performed miracles, comforted others, and told us to love our neighbor as ourselves. We have been given gifts from our Father to honor Him and to serve as productive, not passive, parts of the Body.

Poverty

Is not just a lack of resource. Poverty is more accurately broken relationship (with God and others). It is when we don't see the value we have in ourselves, or the value we bring to the community around us.
